

Objective: The child will increase literacy skills after making a craft.

Materials needed:

White sheet of paper

Marker

Alphabet People Face Pieces (printable)

Glue stick or Glue

Scissors (you will use only)

Procedures:

- 1. Have them do this at an easy, cleanable table.
- 2. Ask them which letter they would like you to write, to make a "letter person."
- 3. Write that letter on the white sheet of paper in upper case form only. Such as: A
- 4. You will already have to cut out the face pieces for them before doing lesson.
- 5. Let them glue face pieces onto their letter. Do not tell them where they go, this is how they learn & show you they understand face structure. Let them choose which face pieces they want for their letter person.



6. Let them color their face when finished, if desired. Have child "give it a name!" Such as "Ashley the A" or "Benny the B"

Optional activity:

After finished and dried, let your child make up a story about their "letter person." Make sure you write down their story (can do so on the back side of their letter person sheet) and read it back to them after they are done telling it. This is great when they get older to re-read back to them; you will both get a laugh out of the creativity they thought of.

Milestones to meet:

The child can place facial features on the letter to resemble a "person's face." The child can make up a creative story to tell about their "letter person."

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
