



# Alphabet Tree

## Ages 4 years—5 years

**Objective:** The child can recognize the alphabet after to reading a story and gluing letters to a tree.

### Materials needed:

“Chicka Chicka Boom Boom” storybook by: Bill Martin  
(this book is typically at every public library you can check out)

Tree Cutout (printable)

ABC Chart (printable)

Glue or glue stick

Scissors

### Procedures:

1. Sitting in a quiet area, read the storybook with your child.
2. Have child sit at a table. You, or your child, will have to pre-cut out all of the letters in chart.
3. Give child the tree. Help with glue as necessary.
4. Model and show child what you want them to do. Put a dot of a glue on the tree, and put one letter on it at a time.
5. Have child glue letters on tree, saying each of them to you as they do so.



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6. Do this same thing, until all letters from the chart have been individually glued on the tree, and said by your child.
7. Hang it on the refrigerator.

### Milestones to meet:

The child can recognize letters. The child can create using fine-motor skills to squeeze glue. The child can listen to an alphabet story. The child can repeat saying letters.

### Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
