

Objective: The child begins recognizing the letter E.

Materials needed:

Plastic Eggs

White paper and Marker

Large Stickers

Procedures:

- 1. Write the letter Ee on the white sheet of paper. Show your child the letter E.
- 2. Tell them, "This is the letter E. E says eh."
- 3. Have them try to say the letter after you and the letters sound.
- 4. Show your child the eggs. Let them explore with them on own. Break some apart and help them to put back together. Talk about their shape and colors. Play: mix and match eggs!
- 5. While holding one up to show them: Say, "This is an egg. It begins with the letter E; eh is for egg." Again, have them try to say the letter and word egg after you.
- 6. While helping, give your child stickers and let them place stickers on the letter E sheet.



7. Find other things around your house
which begin with the letter E.
8. Show them to your child, repeating the

Milestones to meet:

The child is introduced to letters and begins to associate objects to a word/beginning letter sound. The child uses fine-motor skills to peel stickers and place on a letter.
