

Objective: The child will learn same and different after matching wrapping paper.

Materials needed:

Variety of wrapping paper—colors, designs, themes **Procedures**

- 1. Have your child sit on the floor with you.
- 2. Before hand, cut square pieces of each kind of wrapping paper (2 from each kind/color/design).
- 3. You are going to teach and help your child understand similarities by matching together same kinds of wrapping paper; putting the matching square pieces together.
- 4. Using wrapping paper that has a specific design on it, cut it up into large puzzle pieces and then help your child put it back together!
- 5. Build your child's fine-motor skills by then tearing up the pieces of wrapping paper with their fingers.



6. Helping with glue, have your child stick the pieces of torn up wrapping paper to a blank sheet of paper for extra creative thought

Milestones to meet:

The child builds understanding of matching similarities by putting together same pieces of wrapping paper. The child can use finemotor skills to tear paper into pieces.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
