

Objective: The child begins to recognize the letters and sounds in their name.

Materials needed:

Marker
White pieces of paper (1 for every letter in their name)

Procedures:

- 1. On each piece of white paper, write one letter in their name, so that when lined up, it spells your child's name.
- 2. Point and say each letter, spelling out your child's name. Now clap out their name. Count all of the letters to see how many there are in their name. Repeat these three steps one more time to teach.



- 3. Grab their hand and have them touch each letter, while you say it out loud to them.
- 4. Now using your finger, trace each of the letters to show your child and say the letter you are finger-tracing to teach.

Milestones to meet:

The child is beginning letter-word association and recognizing the letters in their name.

Evaluation:

Did this lesson work for your child? Why or why not?
