<u>**Music:</u>** Letter Cc Song & Rhyme (for music and movement)</u>


**Infant Activity:** Letter Cc exploration to build sensory development in infants.

#### Activity Procedures:


Using dimes, nickels, pennies, and quarters, have your child place them on their correct match using the coins sheet. Talk about what each of those coins values are.

<u>Coins printable sheet</u>

#### <u>Milestones:</u>

The child learns amounts of specific coins. The child can match a size of a coin to its accurate matching picture.

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<u>Wednesday</u>: Read the eStorybook letter Cc with/to your child

#### Milestones:

How to Teach: Discuss each of these objects in detail, describing them to your child, saying the name of it and asking your child to tell you what letter it starts with.



#### <u>Milestones:</u>

Child builds early reading readiness through word recognition and beginning letters The child builds fine-motor skills through tracing letters The child begins to recognize letter Cc



Go through this word list with your child. Write out each of the words individually on strips of white paper.

<u>How to Teach</u>: Spell out each word together, point to the letters as you do so (have child point with you), and after it is spelled out, have child repeat and say the full word out loud. You can draw a small picture of the larger words (nouns) next to the word written out to help with reading skills and recognition.

### **Infant Activity**

#### Materials needed:

Containers (empty, plastic, or boxes) Preferably ones that require manipulating, such as opening and closing, have lids, or twist and turn

#### What to teach:

Place the containers on the floor in front of your Infant. Have them explore and learn with them by grabbing them to pick up and manipulate with. Teach them how they work. Do they open and close? Have lids? Twist and turn? Show and model how to do those skills for your infant to see and learn, then watch to see if they attempt to try!
