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Tuesday: Complete the letter Nn activity

Activity Procedures:

Using noodles (choose two different kinds: multi-colored & sizes), white paper, and glue. Today your going to let your child create noodle patterns. Help and teach your child how to make AB-type patterns with the two different kinds of noodles, gluing them to the white paper. You can create colored noodle patterns too.

Milestones:

The child uses fine-motor skills to create and glue with noodles.

The child learns how to make AB-type patterns.

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Wednesday: Read the eStorybook letter Nn with/to your child

* Print and read it to your child, OR have your child sit in your lap and read it with you from the computer screen

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Infant Activity

Materials needed:

Sticky Notes

Marker

What to teach:

Before hand, write the letters in your child's name on the sticky notes (one letter per sticky note).

Place them low down on a wall somewhere in your house. Encourage your infant to grab at the letters and take the notes off of the wall. Keep teaching and encouraging your infant to build fine-motor skills and learn shapes drawn on sticky notes!
