Weekly Lessons & Activities

Monday: Complete the "Art food sensory" letter activity; let your child glue rice and raisins to the letter Rr printable sheet

Tuesday: Complete the letter Rr activity

Wednesday: Read the eStorybook letter Rr with/to your child

Thursday: Explore letter Rr objects

Friday: Complete the letter Rr word list and tracer page

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Extension Activities and Resources

Assessment Rubric: At the end of every letter unit. For parents to keep track of their child's learning for each activity completed. This is an easy way to manage the skills they have mastered, and those they need to continue to work on with their parent.

Music: Letter Rr Song & Rhyme (for music and movement)

Infant Activity: Letter Rr exploration to build sensory development in infants.

Letter of the week "Rr"

Monday: Complete the "Art food sensory" letter activity; let your child glue rice and raisins onto the letter Rr printable sheet. Have them smear the glue first, and then take small pinches of rice to put on the Rr, while also placing the raisins one at a time.

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Tuesday: Complete the letter Rr activity

Activity Procedures:

Using a straw and a black sheet of paper, you are going to "make rain" with your child. Put a small amount of water on the paper. Using the straw, model to show your child first, blow the water on the paper, creating 'rain drops'. Afterwards, let them use blue finger paint and white paper to create "rain drops" with their thumbs!

Milestones:

The child builds mouth motor-skills through blowing. The child uses fine-motor skills through finger painting.

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Wednesday: Read the eStorybook letter Rr with/to your child

* Print and read it to your child, OR have your child sit in your lap and read it with you from the computer screen

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Thursday: Explore letter Rr objects.

Milestones:

Child builds early reading readiness through word recognition and beginning letters

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Go through this word list with your child. Write out each of the words individually on strips of white paper.

How to Teach: Spell out each word together, point to the letters as you do so (have child point with you), and after it is spelled out, have child repeat and say the full word out loud. You can draw a small picture of the larger words (nouns) next to the word written out to help with reading skills and recognition.
