<u>Monday</u>: Complete the "Art food sensory" letter activity; let your child paint using a can of tomato sauce and paint brush on the letter Tt printable sheet

Extension Activities and Resources

Infant Activity: Letter Tt exploration to build sensory development in infants.


<u>Monday</u>: Complete the "Art food sensory" letter activity; let your child paint using a can of tomato sauce and paint brush on the letter Tt printable sheet

<u>Milestones:</u>

Child builds fine-motor skills through finger painting

<u>**Tuesday</u>:** Complete the letter Tt activity <u>Activity Procedures:</u></u>

T is for Tissue!!! Gather up tissues and tissue paper. Have your child build finemotor skills by tearing it up! Afterwards, use a marker to write the letter Tt on white paper. The child can glue the pieces of torn up tissue paper on the letter as a form of tracing and writing.

<u>Milestones:</u>

The child uses fine-motor skills to tear tissue paper. The child can glue paper to the letter Tt and mimics tracing it by doing so.

<u>Wednesday</u>: Read the eStorybook letter Tt with/to your child

* Print and read it to your child, OR have your child sit in your lap and read it with you from the computer screen

<u> Milestones:</u>

Thursday: Explore letter Tt objects.

How to Teach: Discuss each of these objects in detail, describing them to your child, saying the name of it and asking your child to tell you what letter it starts with.

<u>How to Teach</u>: Spell out each word together, point to the letters as you do so (have child point with you), and after it is spelled out, have child repeat and say the full word out loud. You can draw a small picture of the larger words (nouns) next to the word written out to help with reading skills and recognition.

Infant Activity

Materials needed:

Tissue Paper

What to teach:

Place the tissue paper on the floor in front of your infant. Watch as they will build hand-eye coordination to grab at the paper. Listen to the sounds it makes. Teach and discuss what sounds they may hear, how the tissue paper feels, and ways to tear it up. Model and show your infant how to tear it up with your fingers. Let child explore freely.
