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Extension Activities and Resources

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Monday: Complete the "Art food sensory" letter activity; let your child glue on the "U"s in Lucky Charms cereal onto the letter Uu printable sheet.

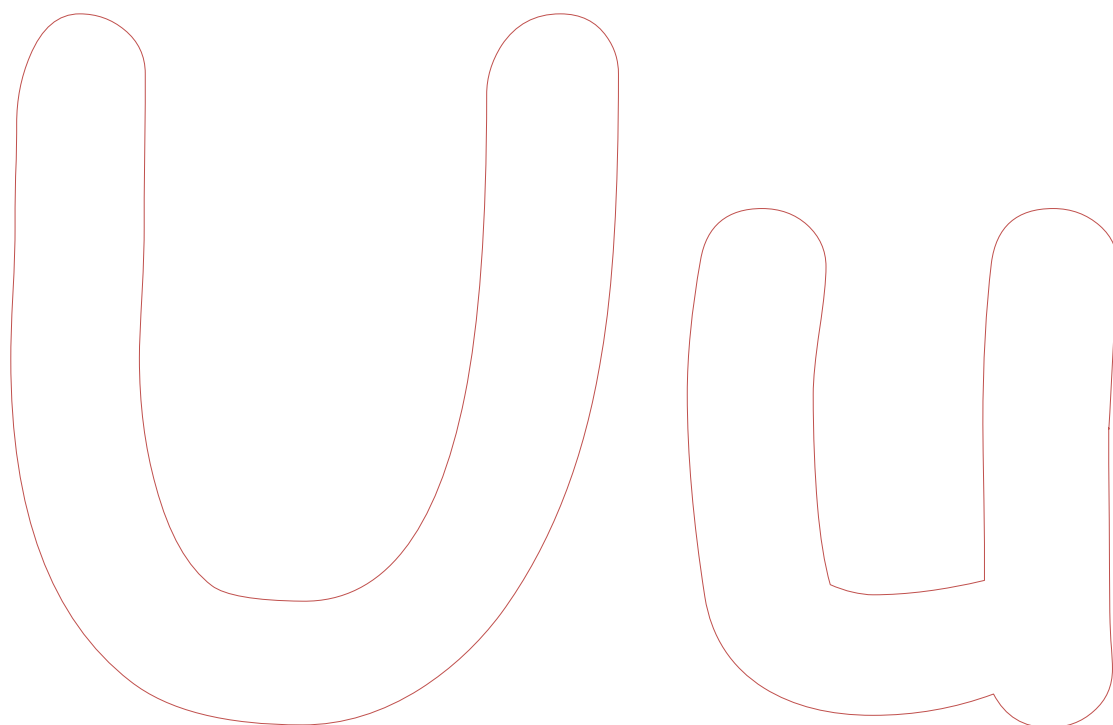

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Tuesday: Complete the letter Uu activity

Activity Procedures:

There are going to be two different activities to do with your child today. The first one involves going "under objects." You can crawl under tables, chairs, or beds with your child. Be specific in asking and telling your child "where are we?" UNDER! Focus on that word by doing actions accordingly. The second activity involves umbrellas. Show your child how they open and close. Have them try to open and close it on their own.

Milestones:

The child understands the concept of under.
The child tries to open/close an umbrella.

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Wednesday: Read the eStorybook letter Uu with/to your child

* Print and read it to your child, OR have your child sit in your lap and read it with you from the computer screen

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Infant Activity

Materials needed:

Umbrella

What to teach:

Sitting on the floor with your infant, show them the umbrella. Teach how it works, opening and closing it. Build the concept of open and close by saying those words as you do the actions using the umbrella. Repeat opening and closing (saying words) the umbrella showing your infant about 5 times.
