

## WEEKLY ACTIVITY BOXES

<b>MONDAY</b>	<b>MATERIALS NEEDED:</b>
Focus on cutting, tearing, and ripping paper. Helps develop a child's fine-motor skills.	White paper, tissue paper, scissors, coffee filters
<b>TUESDAY</b>	<b>MATERIALS NEEDED:</b>
Coloring and Stickers. Helps develop a child's creative thinking, art, and fine-motor skills.	White paper, crayons or markers, and stickers.
<b>WEDNESDAY</b>	<b>MATERIALS NEEDED:</b>
Counting and sorting. Have your child place the correct amount of beans on each number card. Have them sort beans in the egg carton. Helps develop a child's math skills.	Large beans (lima preferred), empty egg carton, and numbers 1-10 on white sheets of paper (like number cards)

<b>THURSDAY</b>	<b>MATERIALS NEEDED:</b>
<p>Guess-N-Discover! Have your child try to guess what is in each bag. Pull it out to find their answer. Have them group items (compare and contrast) according to similarities or differences. Tell them to lay each item out after they "guess and pull it out of the bag." Group when all bags are gone through. Helps to develop a child's thinking skills and science skills.</p>	<p>7 brown paper bags Crayons 1 pencil Chalk (sidewalk chalk is okay) Marshmallows Few pieces of toilet paper Beans Coins</p> <p>*Put one item in each bag of its own. Group according to attributes: Things you write with, soft items, and hard items are a few similar categories.</p>
<b>FRIDAY</b>	<b>MATERIALS NEEDED:</b>
<p>Matching and sorting same colors. Have your child put the same colored balls in same groups. Go through each color with your child; have them say the colors name. Helps to develop a child's math skills.</p>	<p>Pompom balls, a divided tray or empty egg carton for sorting.</p> <p>*To increase fine-motor abilities; add in tongs, clips, or tweezers for them to pinch and grasp the balls and transfer to the tray or carton.</p>
