WEEKLY ACTIVITY BOXES

MONDAY	MATERIALS NEEDED:
Focus on reading skills! Take out items (roughly 10 is always enough), boxed foods or cans, that your child can practice reading. Older kids: Have them re-write the word of the item (I.e. They write 'Cheerios' when looking at the box of cereal Cheerios)	Food items in your pantry! Optional for older children: White lined paper (or print out kid-friendly writing paper on our Word Work Page-Free Resources link) Pencil or something to write with
TUESDAY	MATERIALS NEEDED:
Have your child practice their fine-motor skills grasping and stringing objects. *Tip: Tie a large knot at the bottom of one end of the string so the Cheerios will not fall off*	String and Cheerios (or any 'holed' cereal such as Fruit Loops or Apple Jacks)
